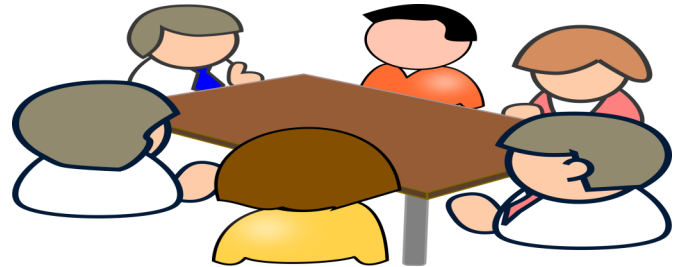

## Too Busy (Ron Mehl)

'll never forget the day I looked out of our living room and saw Mark, our youngest, walking home from school in the driving rain. Mark was in third grade, and he was allowed to ride his bike to his grade school, located right within our sub-division. I happened to be home from the church early that day, and I was sitting in an easy chair by the window. I looked outside at the pouring rain and saw my boy in the distance, trudging his way through the downpour. His clothing was absolutely drenched, and his hair was plastered against his head. I opened the door for him, and he looked up at me with a little smile, his face red from the cold. "Hi, Dad!" he said. "You're home early." "Hi, Son," I replied. "You're soaked to the skin." "Yeah, I know." "Umm, Mark, you know, if you'd ride your bike you'd get home faster. You wouldn't get so wet." He looked at me rather sheepishly as rivulets of rain streamed from his hair down across his face. "I know, Dad." I was puzzled. "Well, Son, if you know, why in the world didn't you do it?" Then he hung his head, just a bit, and it hit me. Boy, did I feel like crawling under a table and hiding for a while. He had told me several times before that his bike had a flat tire. He had asked me, "Dad, could you please fix it for me?" "Sure, Son," I'd promised him. "Don't worry. I'll get after it right away." But I never did. I'd forgotten all about it. As he stood there in the entryway, dripping and shivering, he could have said, "I couldn't ride my bike today because someone promised me, he'd fix it and never did." He would have had every right to say that. But he didn't. What he did say remains printed indelibly on this dad's heart. "Aw, Dad, I know how busy you are and everything, and—I just didn't want to bother you with it again." I thought, Son, your dad isn't too busy; he's just too selfish. For me, a bike tire was no big deal—just one more thing on a long "to do" list. But for Mark, it meant more than transportation. It meant more than a long walk home in the rain. It meant trusting his father to meet his every need.

*When I read this, words like love, integrity, and character came to mind. This young boy could teach us all something. When we think about leaving a legacy, how will those we leave behind remember us? Maybe that's not something we think about anymore. We can't change the past, but we do have some say in how we are experienced by others going forward. What may seem not so important to us, may mean the world to those we love and care about (Husband, Wife, Children, Parents, and friends).*

*Empty words can leave an unfavorable lasting remembrance but love in action carries with it the traits of an honorable, humble, and caring individual. If today is your last day alive, what will your legacy be in the memories of those left behind?*

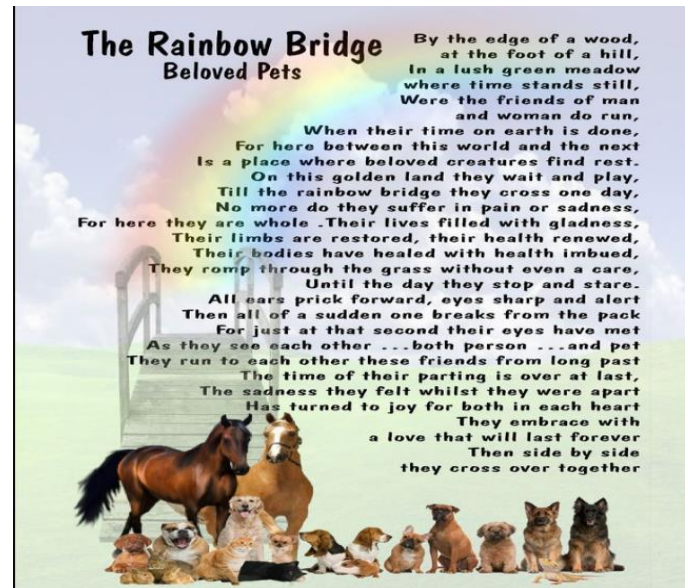

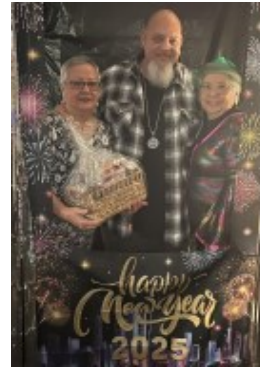

# Sheriff Grady Corner



On January 7, 2025, I was honored to be officially sworn in as Polk County's Sheriff for a sixth consecutive term. To reach that milestone means more to me than words can say

To be able to serve you alongside the most professional men and women in law enforcement anywhere, who put their lives on the line every day; the most professional detention staff members, who walk the halls of our jails and keep inmates safely and securely house; and our civilian support staff, who ensure we are able to deliver professional customer service with a sense of urgency 24 hours a day, seven days a week, is an honor that words can't adequately describe.

The last four years, we accomplished so much here at the Polk County Sheriff's office, thanks to the support of the Board of County Commissioners and the residents who elect them; we added the Live 911 system to everyone on patrol, enabling deputies to hear 911 calls in real-time instead of having to wait to be dispatched to a call; we instituted state-of-the-art investigative technology resources, including an Artificial Intelligence Unit; we built a new training center in Bartow; we launched the National Public Safety Innovation Academy with Polk State College; we added the Guardian, Marshall, and Defender programs to protect students, teachers, and school staff members, as well as county employees; we added digital kiosks in the jails which allows us to eliminate paper and outside contraband from entering our jails; we built a new Sheriff's Processing and Releasing Center; we equipped deputies with Narcan to save overdose victims; we reduced crime to a 5-year low; and we did so much more to keep the people of Polk County safe.

As we look ahead to the next four years, I am excited about what our future holds; a new patrol district, a new K-9 training facility, new additions to our jails, a new city station in Mulberry, and new investigative functions, such as A.I., to name a few.

Being your Sheriff is the most awesome and humbling experience of a lifetime, and I do not take this responsibility lightly. I promise I will continue to vision for the future, work hard, and do all that I can to loyally serve and keep you safe. May God bless you and your families.
